In Memoriam

Past State President Constance Rhodes McGarry (1982-1984)



Constance "Connie" Rhoads McGarry, 86, of Clearfield, passed away Monday, March 22, 2021 at her home. She was born July 5, 1934 in Clearfield, the daughter of Fred L. and Bernece (Chilcott) Rhoads.

Mrs. McGarry was a graduate of Clearfield High School, class of 1952.

She was the office manager for TAFCO, where she retired in 1987 after 32 years.

Mrs. McGarry was a lifetime member of St. Andrews Episcopal Church in Clearfield where she had served as treasurer for several years, was on vestry and president of the altar guild for 17 years.

Connie was the first member of the District 4 Pennsylvania Federation of Business and Professional Women's Club to become state president. She also served as state treasurer twice and on several committees as chairwoman. On the district level, she had served as treasurer, assistant director and director. Mrs. McGarry also served as parliamentarian several times as different chairs. She joined BPW in 1953 and held every office of the club over the years.

Mrs. McGarry served as the first chairwoman of the Clearfield Borough Recreation Committee. She served on the Clearfield Borough Zoning Hearing Board as vice chairwoman for several years and the Clearfield Planning Commission several years and was chairwoman at one time.

1 in 5 families with children have food insecurities and food pantries need our help now more than ever due to the pandemic. Families are hungry not just at the holidays but year round and now, when donations tend to drop off, here are some tips to remember if you wish to donate food.

Sharing wisdom from a food bank volunteer:

- 1. Everyone donates Kraft Mac & Cheese in the box. But it needs milk and butter which is hard to get from food banks,
- 2. Boxed, shelf-stable milk is a treasure. Kids need it for cereal, which they get a lot of.
- 3. Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
- 4. Canned foods should be pop tops OR donate can openers.
- 5. Oil is a luxury needed for Rice a Roni which they get a lot of.
- 6. Spices, salt and pepper are a real gift.
- 7. Tea bags and coffee are caring gifts.
- 8. Sugar and flour are treats.
- 9. Important are fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.
- 10. Seeds are great in spring and summer because growing can be easy for some.
- 11. Rarely is there fresh meat.
- 12. Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
- 13. Hamberger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef.
- 14. They get lots of peanut butter and jelly but NEED sandwich bread.
- 15. Butter or margarine are good.
- 16. Eggs are a commodity!
- 17. Cake mix and frosting makes it possible to make a child's birthday cake.*
- 18. Dishwashing detergent is very expensive and is always appreciated.

Legislation – Cheryl Decoteaux

May 18th is Primary Election Day. Polls are open 7:00AM – 8:00PM. May 3, 2021, is the last day to <u>register to</u> <u>vote or update your voter registration</u> before the May 18, 2021, primary election. If you're mailing a signed voter registration application, it must be **received by your county election office 15 days before an election**. Any voter can choose to <u>vote by mail ballot</u> in the upcoming election using either an absentee or mail-in ballot. Both <u>absentee ballots and mail-in ballots are considered mail ballots</u>. The main difference between the two mail ballots is: Absentee ballot: you need to provide a valid reason to vote by mail ballot. Mail-in

ballot: you don't need to provide a valid reason. You can simply choose to vote by mail ballot. Both <u>absentee</u> <u>and mail-in ballots</u> are equally safe and secure ways to cast your vote. Your completed ballot must be returned by 8:00 p.m. on May 18, 2021.

At the primary Election on May 18, voters will decide two constitutional amendments on the governor's emergency powers, which have been a point of conflict between the Republican-controlled Legislature and Democratic Gov. Tom Wolf during the coronavirus pandemic.


