I'm sure there's no "season" for cyber threats but they seem to come in clusters. Just this past weekend, I received 2 in a matter of 3 days. But, instead of coming through my email, they were text message on my cell phone. The first one confirmed that an order I allegedly placed with a medical marijuana facility in Doylestown was ready for pick-up. The second was from the USPS telling me they couldn't deliver a package until they had my name and address. Huh?

Before I clicked on any link in either message, I called the facility in the first text and, after some investigation, found they do not have me listed as a patient. We figured either someone transposed the phone number or it was entered incorrectly. In all fairness, this probably wasn't a scam but to see a message telling me I purchased marijuana (for whatever reason) was a little unnerving. You have to understand, my Dad was a cop and arrested people for that.

In addition to a link, the second text had two phone numbers — none of which were listed when I looked up the phone number for the North Wales Post Office. I called them because I couldn't figure out why they would have my phone number and not my name and address? In the past, when there's been an issue, I would receive an email with a tracking number or a small brown card in my mailbox.

You really have to be careful because even scam emails can look very official. I receive them from banks where I don't have accounts and even received one from Amazon a few months ago telling me they needed more information to deliver a 65" wide-screen TV. Trust me when I tell you, I live in townhouse and there isn't a wall in my house big enough to mount a 65" TV! Needless to say, I called the police department to report the fraud and my bank to make sure the payment hadn't been deducted from my account. Unfortunately, the police can't do anything unless I had proof that the fraud actually occurred and my bank said they would be watchful and decline any request for that amount of money from my account.

CYBERSECURITY TIP

If you receive an unexpected message that is...



STOP!
It could be a scam!

- → Don't click on links or attachments.
- → Don't share sensitive information.

If you know the sender, independently check with them to see if the message is real. If you don't know the sender, delete it.

I know it's not just me because several of you have had your Facebook and email accounts hacked and sometimes it's almost as bad as losing your wallet. While you're upset about losing any money, replacing your driver's license or calling your credit card companies to report the loss and change cards can be equally or more frustrating. Having to change email accounts and passwords is just as bad.

No matter how careful you are, you could still be hacked or subject to scams. Just make sure you have good security software on your phone, laptop or tablet. Use strong passwords (even if they're a pain to remember) and change them often. Be careful who you give your information to – especially your social security number. And be careful who can see your information online.

Hopefully, with a little vigilance, we can keep our accounts and personal information safe.

Did You Know Conversation Hearts Got Their Start As Medical Lozenges?

Weirdly enough, the story of conversation hearts first began when a Boston pharmacist named Oliver Chase invented a machine that simplified the way medical lozenges — used for sore throats and other illnesses — could be made. The result was America's first candy-making machine, because the pharmacist soon started shifting his focus from making lozenges to candy instead! Chase founded the New England Confectionery Company, or Necco, and the candy lozenges soon became what we know today as Necco wafers. Conversation hearts didn't get messages until 1866.

Our speaker will be Karen Ploch the curator at the Historical Society of Montgomery County.

Karen received her BA in History with a minor in Museum Studies from SUNY Oswego in 2014. She went on to receive her MA in History with a concentration in Museum Studies from University of North Carolina, Greensboro in 2017. After graduation,

she moved to the Philadelphia region to be with her now husband, Charles.

Karen started working at the Historical Society of Montgomery County, PA in 2017. As the Curator, she oversees the three-dimensional artifacts in their collection. She also shares interesting bits of county history on our blog, social media, and YouTube channels. Karen, along with other HSMC staff, help researchers with genealogy and general county history questions.

Karen owes her love for history to her parents. Every childhood family vacation included a visit to at least one museum or historic site. She's thrilled to have the opportunity to work with history every day and make it fun and accessible to the public.

Highlight on Marian Anderson



Marian Anderson used her singing voice to break down racial barriers. She began singing at Carnegie Hall in 1920. In April of 1939, after being denied the stage at the Daughters of the American Revolution Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C., Marian Anderson sang in front of the Lincoln Memorial to a crowd of 75,000 guests.

One of the members of the DAR was first lady Eleanor Roosevelt. Outraged by the decision, Roosevelt sent a letter of resignation and wrote about it in her weekly column, "My Day." "They have taken an action which has been widely

criticized in the press," she wrote. "To remain as a member implies approval of that action, and therefore I am resigning."

Perhaps her most iconic moment was her performance of "My Country 'Tis of Thee." In her rendition, she changed the pronouns of certain lines to "we" to be all inclusive and invite all people to be part of the community.

"We cannot live alone. And the thing that made this moment possible for you and for me has been brought about by many people whom we will never know."

Marian Anderson went on to have a tremendously successful singing career. She became the first African American singer to perform in a lead role at the Metropolitan Opera in the role of the sorcerer Ulrica in Giuseppe Verdi's opera "Un ballo in maschera (A Masked Ball)."

Anderson became one of the original board members of The Carnegie Hall Corporation and held more than 50 performances through the mid-1970s at Carnegie Hall.


