

Maura Gillen	another act of senseless violence. Just the week before, it was a grocery store in Buffalo, NY and yesterday, it was a medical center in Tulsa, OK. The list above doesn't even
Treasurer	include the businesses, churches, concerts, or movie theaters where innocent people
Noreen Morello	were gunned down going about their daily lives. Nowhere is safe.
Corresponding	Everytown For Gun Safety defines a mass shooting as any incident in which four or more people are shot and killed, including the shooter. By this definition, the United States
Secretary	experiences an average of 19 mass shootings every year, ranging from 15 mass shootings
Trish Corvo	in 2010 and in 2014, to a high of 24 mass shootings in both 2011 and 2013. However, there exists no consensus on the definition of a mass shooting. Counts under other
Parliamentarian	definitions range from a dozen per year to nearly one mass shooting every day depending on factors such as casualty thresholds or whether the mass shooting was
Barbara Jean	public or not. By any count, the number of mass shootings that plague this country is far too high and the counts are just a small fraction of the lives left forever changed after the tragedy of a mass shooting. (Everytown For Gun Safety)

Offering thoughts and prayers is just not working – we need to do something! And by "do something", I'm not talking about taking away all guns. The majority of gun owners are responsible and handle their weapons safely. Universal background checks, closing gun show loopholes, and reinstating the ban on assault weapons and large-capacity magazines would be a good place to start. When states have toughened their gun laws, it has made a difference. For example, in Massachusetts, which has one of the lowest gun death rates in America, you must take a four-hour gun safety course, get character references from two people, and have a one-on-one interview with a police officer to buy a gun.

Firearms are the #1 leading cause of death for American children and teens. If we don't do something now, how long will it be before there's another school shooting? Where will it be next time? Vernfield Elementary School (my niece Ellie's school)? Montgomery Elementary? Norristown High School?

Before starting his show last Tuesday, Jimmy Kimmel addressed the issue, "This is not a time for moments of silence, this is a time to be loud and to stay loud, and not stop until we fix this. Some people say this is a mental health problem. Others say it's a gun problem. It is both, and it can be both. So let's work on both of those."

Kimmel noted that all Americans care about protecting children and keeping guns out of the hands of those who intend to do harm with them and he ended by saying, "There have been 27 school shootings so far this year in this country, and it's May. How does this make sense to anyone? These are our children."

British Columnist, Dan Hodges said, "In retrospect, Sandy Hook marked the end of the U.S. gun control debate. Once America decided killing children was bearable, it was over." Is the debate over? I hope not. Look at the sweet faces of the children killed at Robb Elementary School

in the picture above. Think of your own children, grandchildren, nephews and nieces and ask, is this the country you want them to live in? No child should ever be afraid to go to school. No child should ever have to wipe the blood of their classmate on themselves and pretend to be dead to survive a school shooting

Four actions you can take now to help end the gun violence crisis:

- 1. Tell your senators and representatives to take bold action on gun safety.
- 2. Join Moms Demand Action, Everytown for Gun Safety, Sandy Hook Promise, CeaseFirePA, or the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence.
- 3. Join an upcoming volunteer event in your community.



#### New Monument Planned to Honor Women

Did you know you're more likely to see a mermaid than a congresswoman memorialized in American monuments in the United States?

Up against the centuries-old obsession with white military men in the American monument landscape, women in Lexington, Mass. – ground zero of American military history – are leading the charge to create a monument to women in the town's history.

"To address this misrepresentation in Lexington, a dedicated group of volunteers formed the LexSeeHer monument project, in order to commemorate women who have made significant economic, political, intellectual, social and cultural contributions in the 'Birthplace of American Liberty'—starting from the early years of the town's

"The monument features over 20 women of different ages, races, professions and other lenses of identity, and spins a more inclusive narrative of Lexington's history by making women's contributions to their community and country visible,' said Jessie Steigerwald, president of LexSeeHer.

"Designed by Meredith Bergmann, the monument portrays these women in bas relief around an empty central space so visitors can stand among these important women to take their place in the sweep of history. Organizers envision a website where people can share photos of themselves."


