## \*\*LAST CALL\*\* District 11 Project – Pill Bottle Donations

The March 19th Dinner Meeting will be the LAST DAY to bring your empty pill bottles.

Matthew 25: Ministries accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. Their pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription and over the counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill bottles with and without secure caps (child-resistant)

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments are recycled and may generate revenue that supports Matthew 25: Ministries' programs. If you wish to prepare bottles for shipment rather than recycling, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Sort bottles by color and type
- Remove labels leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.

Rinse and dry thoroughly.
