But we also recognized her as our Woman of the Year. Her film and book on "Finding Justice" shows the determination of learning and sharing our women's suffrage story. #### Past State President and Past District Eleven Director Jane N. Barndt



Jane Barndt, 94, passed away Thursday October 8, 2020, at the Green Home in Wellsboro. Jane graduated from Wellsboro High School in the class of 1944, and earned a BS in Business Education from Bloomsburg University, she also graduated from courses of study in Penn State and Rider Universities. Jane was a teacher and taught for 31 years, 27 of them in the Quakertown School District in Quakertown, PA. On August 26, 1956, she married E. Ralph Barndt, with

whom she shared 52 years of marriage, until his death in 2008. She was a member of the 1st Presbyterian Church of Wellsboro, a member, past president and past state president of B.P.W., a member of Rotary International and a Paul Harris Fellow recipient, member of: Partners and Community Health, Elder Task Force and Governor Committee, Area Aging Council of Tioga County, and was a member and past president of: Friends of the Green Free Library, Tioga County Cancer Society, and Wellsboro Hospital Auxiliary.

President Nancy remembers ... Although I did not teach with Jane, she installed me as Quakertown President in 1978 (first time). She was going to be installed as the BPW/PA President only a few weeks later. She served for 2 years as our State President. Yes, 2 years and that was before fax, cell phones and all our other modern tech. She taught during the day and was off to meetings in the evening across the state. Loved the times when Pennridge BPW and Quakertown BPW would have our yearly gatherings at the VFW or wherever. Jane was always there.

When Pennridge BPW closed its doors, Jane asked to join us at Quakertown BPW. She was happy that she could stay a member in District 11 even though we knew she would be retiring back to her home area of Wellsboro. She shared her membership with Wellsboro BPW and us. Just a few years ago, Elfriede, Janet and I took the long drive to Wellsboro to visit with her. At this time she was in a lovely retirement setting and she so enjoyed introducing us to everyone on staff. We had a lovely luncheon and took some photos. Judy had placed a few in the Quaker Quill. But my favorite time was visiting her apartment filled with photos and BPW gifts and hearing her many BPW memories. That was one special day, long but very memorable. I wish that all of you could have known her. She was a true educator and a dedicated BPW mentor to all who needed her wisdom. She will be missed.

I am incredibly happy to see the Senate has unanimously passed my bipartisan Rosie the Riveter Congressional Gold Medal Act.

During World War II, women across our country, and across Pennsylvania, left their homes to work in support of the war effort. These patriots worked as riveters, buckers, welders, and electricians. These 'Rosie the Riveters' embodied the 'We can do it' spirit forever connected with the famous poster.

I am especially proud to represent Levittown's Mae Krier, who helped build B-17 and B-29 Bombers during World War II. Mae's tireless advocacy for her fellow Rosies helped get this legislation through the House and Senate, and to the President's desk.

## America's First Suffragette - Abigail Adams



"If we mean to have heroes, statesmen and philosophers, we should have learned women." - Abigail Adams (1744-1818)

In honor of her 276th birthday on November 13<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate this pioneering and vocal champion of women's rights and equality, who was considered one of the most respected and influential women of the early revolutionary period of American history.

In March 31, 1776, Abigail wrote to her husband, John Adams, urging him and the other members of the Continental Congress to "remember the ladies" in fighting for America's independence from Great Britain and making the laws by which the new nation would be governed. "I long to hear that you have declared an independency. And, by the way, in the new code of laws which I suppose it will

be necessary for you to make, I desire you would remember the ladies and be more generous and favorable to them than your ancestors. Do not put such unlimited power into the hands of the husbands. Remember, all men would be tyrants if they could. If particular care and attention is not paid to the ladies, we are determined to foment a rebellion, and will not hold ourselves bound by any laws in which we have no voice or representation."

#### America's First Woman Vice President-Elect – Kamala Harris



"While I may be the first woman in this office, I will not be the last—because every little girl watching tonight sees that this is a country of possibilities." – Kamala Harris
